Insect Or Not

Are they all insects? No? Well, how many insects can you spot?

Help your toddler identify and circle the insects. Then, introduce the name of each insect.



How this activity helps? Your toddler learns to sort and identify the insects. Help your child describe each insect. Then, narrate stories about different insects. **Colourful Insects**

Insects are of many colours. Here's a colour match where you match colours with insects!

Help your toddler identify the colours and match each of them with the corresponding insects. Introduce the name of each insect.



How this activity helps? Your toddler observes and matches each colour with the corresponding insect. Help your child describe each insect — grasshopper, ladybird, honeybee — and its colours.

Missing Ladybird Spots

Look at the ladybird below. There's something missing, isn't it?

Help your toddler colour each spot in the ladybird in any manner — using crayons or child-friendly paints. Make the spots as colourful as possible.



How this activity helps? Your toddler's creativity is enhanced while colouring the spots of the ladybird. Help your child narrate a story about a colourful little ladybird who is on a walk. What all does it see?

Fingerprinted Butterfly

Flutter, flutter. Look at the butterfly fluttering about. Where did its colours go?

Help your toddler dab some paint in the fingers and make finger impressions to colour the butterfly. Use child-friendly watercolours and make the butterfly as colourful as possible.



How this activity helps?

In this sensorial activity, your toddler learns to colour in a different manner — with fingerprints. Help your child build a story about the colourful butterfly. Where could it be fluttering about?

Fly To Flowers

Bzzz...Buzzzzz.... Two honeybees are looking for flowers.

Help your toddler draw along the dotted lines to guide the honeybees to the flowers.



How this activity helps?

Your toddler's grasp and visual tracking skills improve while tracing on the dotted lines. With your child, discuss about the honeybees — how they collect nectar, where they live, the sound they make, etc.

Insect Banner

Are you ready to colour and decorate your wall with colourful insects?

Help your toddler colour the insects in any manner using crayons, finger-painting, using paintbrush, etc. Once done, cut out along the dotted line and string a yarn through the insects. The insect banner is ready! Put it up on the wall.



How this activity helps? Your toddler chooses a technique to colour the insects and comes up with a colour composition.



How this activity helps? Help your child describe each insect. Start with the name of the insect. You could come up with a rhyme about an insect?

Match The Silhouettes

In one column you have the insects; in the other you have their shadows. But, they are all mixed up!

Help your toddler observe, identify, and match the insects with their silhouettes.



How this activity helps?

Your toddler observes and tries to associate each insect with its corresponding shadow. Name each insect and help your child describe each of them — colour, number of legs, etc.

Finger-paint Beehive

Do you hear the honeybees buzzing around the beehive? But, where did their colours go?

Help your toddler dab some child-friendly paints on the fingers. Then, finger-paint the honeybees and their beehive. Once dry, help your little one describe the scenery.



Your toddler gets a tactile sensory experience while finger-painting the honeybees and beehive. Help your child tell a story about what could be happening in and around the beehive.

Butterfly Mask

Pssst...! You know you can turn into a butterfly. But, first you need to colour it.

Help your toddler colour the butterfly mask in any manner — using crayons, paints, etc. Once done, cut along the dotted lines. Then, thread some yarn through the two small circles to make the mask! Your child is all set for a pretend play.



How this activity helps?

Your toddler creates a mask from scratch by colouring it. Thus, coming up with a colour composition. Introduce your child to the butterfly — is it multi-coloured, how does it fly, etc.

Complete The Insects

There are insects and there are their wings. You have to put them together.

Help your toddler assemble the insects together by cutting and sticking each pair of wings to the corresponding insect. Remember to colour them!



How this activity helps? Your child tries to identify and match the wings of a dragonfly and butterfly. It improves the observation. Help your child describe each insect. Then, you could stick the insects as wall decor!
